## Nature of the Defect:

One of the examples given for the DAY function in SpreadsheetML is incorrect. The standard states that $\operatorname{DAY}(\operatorname{DATE}(2006,0,2)$ ) should result in 31 - in fact, it should be 2 . Zero as month value in the DATE function indicates the twelfth month of the preceding year (as specified in 18.17.7.74) - the second day in December 2005 should have a day value of 2, not 31 .
