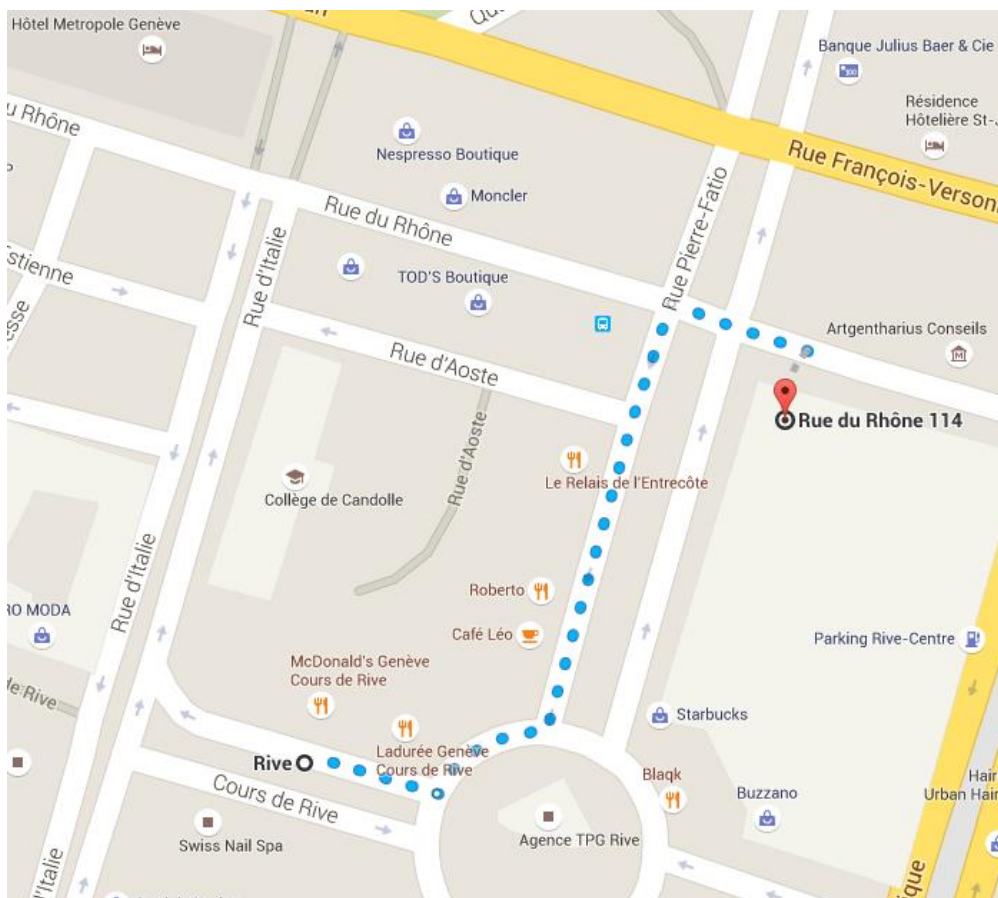

Before leaving the baggage area of [Cointrin airport](#), take your free public transport ticket from the vending machine just before the customs. Then leave through the customs lane, go left and up to the “departure level” to leave the airport. All trains leaving the airport go downtown to Cornavin Station.

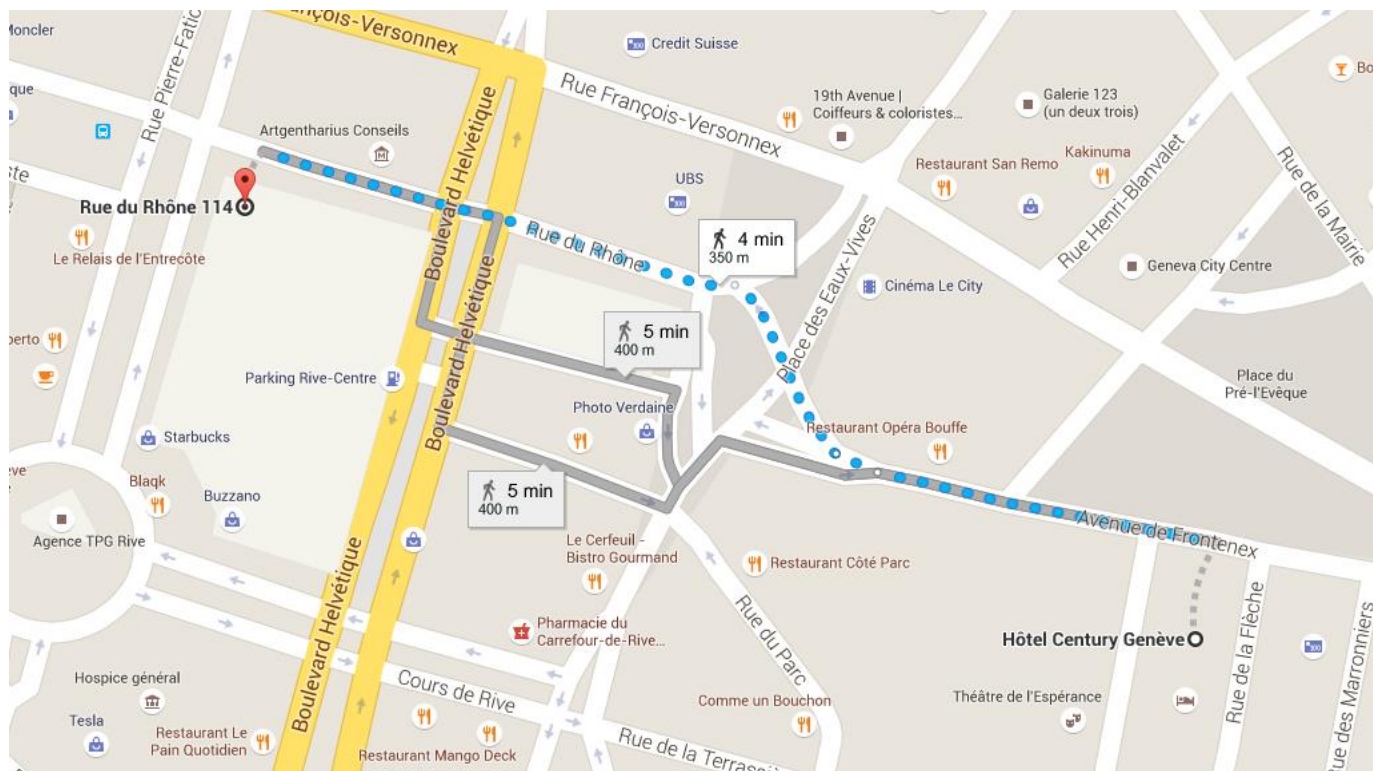
Alternatively, from the airport, for [Ecma](#) take [bus 10](#) and get off at “Rive” (one stop further than “Molard”), cross the tram rails, “Cours de Rive”, and follow the “rond-point de Rive” ¼ circle clockwise; at the Starbucks continue left on the pavement alongside the “Rue Pierre-Fatio” to reach the corner with the “Rue du Rhône”. There take a right and right again around the jewellery to enter number 114 and go up to the 2nd level.



There are several hotels located in the vicinity of the Ecma office most of them within walking distance. We regularly use the following:

Ecma is less than 5 minutes walking from the hotel (see the map below).



Note that another of our regular hotels, Hotel Longemalle, will be closing in September for a year of renovations.

The meeting room will accommodate around 12 people, and we'll have hot and cold drinks. There are plenty of places nearby to eat lunch.

Note: Remember, your ticket from the airport to the city is free if you get it from the machine before exiting the baggage area. Then, every hotel at which I've stayed has given me a free bus pass for the duration of my stay. The meeting place is in the old town, but if you stay across the river, it is an easy bus ride to Ecma.

If you have a free day (or will have accompanying guests), I recommend taking the train to Lausanne and then transferring to the ferry to [Montreux](#). (You can return by train all the way.) Arriving by ferry is much more interesting than by train, more so if the weather is clear.
